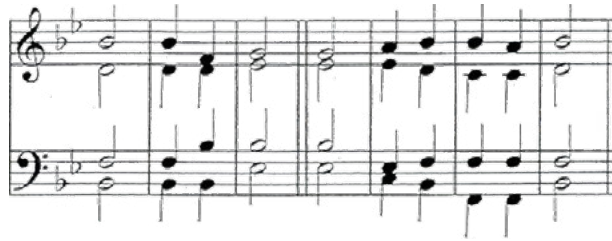

THE SECOND LESSON *Acts 10:34-43*

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: “I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ--he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.”



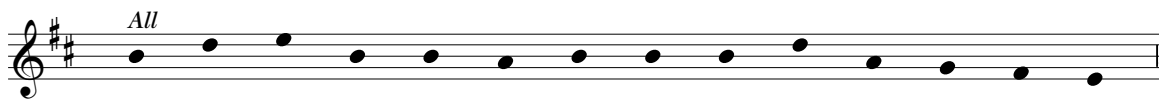

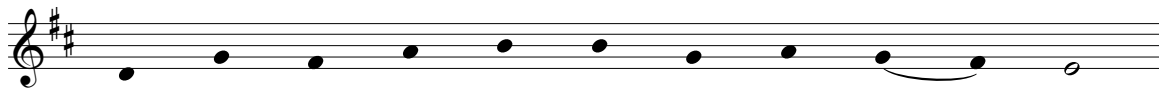

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Leader In joy and hope, let us pray to God, who raises us to new life in Christ. *A brief silence* God of resurrection, accept our thanks and praise on this Easter Day for raising Jesus Christ from the tomb. We thank you for the gift of new life, a second chance, a fresh start, a clear morning. Help us to accept the new life you offer to us, and like the women at the tomb, to go quickly and share the good news.

People **God of joy and hope, hear our prayer.**

God of creation, you have filled the world with beauty. We thank you for warming sun, greening grass, and blooming flowers. Open our eyes to behold the beauty of your creation in this and every season and help us to be good stewards of the earth. **God of joy and hope, hear our prayer.**

God of community, we give you thanks for this congregation and our worship together. May those who are visiting today find their spirits refreshed by our worship and welcome. **God of joy and hope, hear our prayer.**

God of peace, we pray for all involved in the war in the Middle East, Ukraine, and all places torn apart by conflict. Provide safe havens for civilians and refugees, sustain those working to provide relief, and comfort those who mourn the dead. Grant wisdom, restraint, and humility to the leaders of the nations, that they may choose paths that protect life and lead to a just and

lasting peace. Guide and protect members of the armed forces that they may act with deep regard for the dignity of every human being. **God of joy and hope, hear our prayer.**

God of healing, we pray for those in any need or trouble. We remember those on our prayer list, those whose sufferings are known to you alone, and those we name either aloud or in our hearts. *Silence* Surround them with your healing presence and restore them to wholeness and health in your good time and in your good way. **God of joy and hope, hear our prayer.**

God of relationships, we pray for those who are dear to each of us. *Silence* Bless all whose lives are closely linked with ours. Grant that we may serve Christ in them and love one another as he loves us. **God of joy and hope, hear our prayer.**

God of eternity, we remember those in whose memory the flowers are given today, and all others whom we love but see no longer. In the rising of the sun and in its going down, we remember them. In the opening of buds and in the rebirth of spring, we remember them. When we have joys we yearn to share, we remember them. Thank you, O God, for giving them to us, to know and to love as companions on our earthly pilgrimage. Bless them and keep them, make your face to shine upon them, and grant them peace. **God of joy and hope, hear our prayer.**

God of glory, you made the world in beauty and restore all things through the victory of Jesus Christ. We pray that, wherever your image is still disfigured by poverty, sickness, racism, selfishness, war, or greed, the new creation in Jesus Christ may appear in justice, love, and peace, to the glory of your name. **Amen.**

Eucharistic Prayer A

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Celebrant It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

But chiefly are we bound to praise you for your glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. By his death he has destroyed death, and by his rising to life again he has won for us everlasting life.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Celebrant Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

People **Christ has died.**
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

Celebrant We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

All **Amen.**

Please come forward and stand or kneel at the rail.
